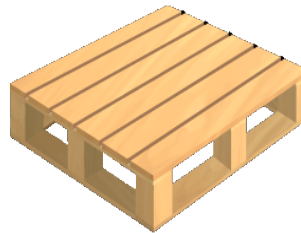


1. Select Pallets

- Choose pallets large enough to prevent overhand of shipment pieces
- Never exceed the rated capacity of your pallet
- Do not buy pallets with broken boards or protruding nail heads
- Use pallets with four-way forklift entry as they help to improve handling and reduce damage



2. Stack Boxes on Pallet

- Align boxes in columns, corner to corner or interlock them for the greatest stacking strength
- Do not align corners over the spaces between pallet deck boards
- Keep the top layer flat to prevent damage from top loads
- Use a slip sheet under the load and every third layer when possible to help distribute the weight evenly and protect the bottom



3. Secure Shipment to Pallet

- Use stretch wrapping and plastic or metallic strapping or banding.
- Use corner/edge boards to increase stacking strength and prevent damage to corner edges and stabilize the load.

- Use top/bottom load protectors, these are layers of corrugated fiberboard or heavy paperboard that help to distribute the weight of shipments.



4. Label Shipment

Label each pallet with telephone numbers and complete address information including postal code of the shipper and the consignee.
